What is Sociology?

Sociology is the disciplined effort to understand society, social and cultural relations, the social institutions, and the persistent patterns of social behaviors that characterize all social life. The sociology program prepares students for professional work in the social sciences and also provides them with the tools to make sense of the aspects of social life.

Sociology at Kyung Hee

Founded in 1988, the Sociology Department at Kyung Hee University is designed not only to provide students with a firm foundation in the discipline but also to encourage students to pursue their particular interests. The department's curriculum has emphasized students' strong quantitative as well as analytical skills and methodology.

There are two academic tracks leading to the B.A. in sociology major. The intensive single major track provides a more comprehensive introduction to sociological concepts, theories, and methods, and prepares students for graduate study or for professional work in the area. The dual major track - sociology with another major - prepares students for more general applications.

Degree Requirements

The requirements for the intensive single major track include:

- 22 courses in sociology courses (66 credits): 7 required courses (21 credits) and 15 elective courses (45 credits)
- a graduation thesis (this may be waived if a certain level of English proficiency is approved)

The requirements for the dual-major track include:

- 16 courses (48 credits) in sociology including 7 required courses (21 credits) and 9 elective courses (27 credits)
- a graduation thesis (this may be waived if a certain level of English proficiency is approved)
