## What is Nursing?

Nursing encompasses the autonomous and collaborative care of individuals of all ages, families, groups and communities, the sick or well, and in all settings. Prevention of illness, individualized nursing care, and health promotion are included in the scope of nursing practice. A nurse is a profession within the health care sector focused on the care of individuals, families, and communities so they may attain, maintain, or recover optimal health and quality of life. Nurses pursue higher quality of nursing care that combines efficiency, humanity, advocacy, safe environment, and scientific evidence based on philosophy of humanity and holistic care.

## Nursing at Kyung Hee University

As the goal of Kyung Hee University, College of Nursing Science pursues the cultivation of creative and competent nursing profession contributed to the fulfillment of a cultural world for humanity, based on the founding principle of “creating a civilized world.” We included four main components to constitute our goals : Creating of civilized world based on ‘Creative efforts’, ‘progressive spirits’, and ‘productive cooperation’, Vision of Kyung Hee University as ‘towards global eminence’, Metaparadigm of nursing science which includes human, health, environment, and nursing and core competences as well as university of nursing care.
