Credit Hours & Grading

- 3 credit courses: A total of 45 hours of in-class sessions
- Grading is based on attendance, class discussion, homework, and examinations. Elements of assessment may be determined by each instructor. Kyung Hee University regulations require a minimum of 70% attendance for students to receive academic credits.
- All domestic and overseas students may transfer credits according to the policies of their home institutions.
- In case of undergraduate students at KHU, grades will be marked as Pass/Non-Pass on their transcripts.
